The challenge was to narrow down the field of great applicants that we received, representing diverse areas, sectors, interests and skills across the region. They will draw on their respective relationships, knowledge and passion to help address issue facing our communities and food systems.

The first meeting of the Council will take place in January 2017 and meet approximately eight times throughout the year. Together, this group will explore needs across the Central Kootenay as they relate to food systems. The Council will determine what is happening that could use some support, and what can be done to help ensure that food producers can make a good living here and that our residents have access to healthy food, no matter where they live or what their income level.

The Council's strong links with local government will ensure that where public policy can be shifted or created to address the needs identified, we will have the necessary relationships in place to make it happen. The diverse membership on the Council, by sector and location, will help to ensure that the many great initiatives across the Central Kootenay can be more effectively networked to create more strategic, effective and efficient change for the better in our communities and food systems.
